

URINARY SYMPTOMS IN WOMEN AGED 16-65

A number of local pharmacies now offer a 'one stop' service for assessing women aged 16-65 with urinary symptoms. Pharmacists can now directly issue a prescription if it is thought to be appropriate. We hope this new service will provide an efficient and convenient way to deal with your symptoms.

If you answer 'no' to all the questions below then it is likely that your local pharmacy will be able to deal with your problem. If you answer 'yes' then you may need to speak to a GP.

1. Are you pregnant?
2. Are you allergic to trimethoprim or cotrimoxazole (Septrin)
3. Have you had a urine infection in the last 28 days or multiple urine infections in the last few months?
4. Are you diabetic?
5. Have you any kidney problems?

Please do not deliver urine samples to the GP practice unless specifically requested to by a GP or member of staff on their behalf
